Lupus can strike men and women at any age, but 85% of the cases occur in females between the ages of 10 and 40; and WHEREAS:

Lupus is also called autoimmune disease in which the patient's immune system is out of control and attacks the patient's own blood and tissues; and

WHEREAS: With early diagnosis and treatment, an 85% survival rate is not uncommon; and

The Lupus Foundation of America and our Minnesota Chapter, a non-profit organization, was formed to gain public awareness of this baffling disease and to support research in order to seek new methods of control, prevention and, hopefully, to find a cure; WHEREAS:
