WHEREAS: Recognition and celebration of its history is an essential element in the fabric of a great city's life; and

WHEREAS: The historic East Bank area is the birthplace of the City of Minneapolis; and

WHEREAS: Many great cities have made of their waterfronts places of public celebration and symbols of community pride; and

WHEREAS: Minneapolis is graced by the Mississippi River, the Father of Waters, and by St. Anthony Falls, the only waterfall on the entire length of the Mississippi and the genesis of much of the early population and economic growth of this area; and

WHEREAS: The planners of the Riverplace development have elected to make of this project a blending of the city's heritage and a recognition of contemporary urban lifestyle demands; and

WHEREAS: Riverplace exemplifies a salutary level of urban living, combining living, working and recreational space within a self-contained area; and

WHEREAS: Riverplace introduces an element of community festivity and celebration into our downtown living environment;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, September 8, 1984, to be

### RIVERPLACE DAY


in Minnesota and welcome citizens to join in sharing this celebration of the Minneapolis riverfront.
