

I, A.G. Lundson, Mayor of the City of Detroit, Minnesota, and E.J. Bessick, City Clerk of said City of Detroit, do hereby certify that the Charter Commission of the City of Detroit, did on the 26th day of July 1926, report and recommend to the City Council of the City of Detroit, Minnesota, the adoption of the amendment hereto attached.

That the council did on the 27th day of July 1926, call a Special Election to be held in said City on the 7th day of September 1926, for the purpose of voting upon the adoption or rejection of said amendment.

That the publication of said amendment was made in Three (3) newspapers of the County of Becker, in the State of Minnesota for a period of Thirty (30) days.

That on the 7th day of September 1926, a special election was held which resulted as follows:

Total number of votes cast - 446.

For the Amendment 266; Against the Amendment 80.

Whereupon the following resolution was unanimously adopted by the City Council:

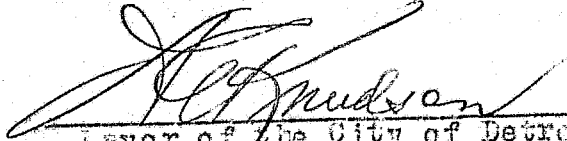

WHEREAS, the City Council after canvassing the ballots cast at said election have found that the vote was as follows:

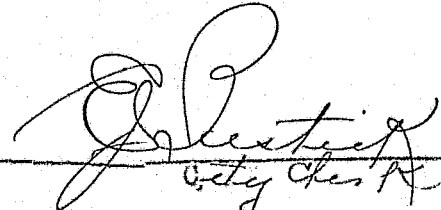
Total number of votes cast 446:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1 OF THE CITY CHARTER OF THE
CITY OF DETROIT, BECKER COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

RELATIVE TO THE NAME AND POWERS OF THE CITY.

That Section 1 of the Charter of the City of Detroit be
amended so as to read as follows:

"All that district of country in the County of Becker and
State of Minnesota, contained within the limits and boundaries
hereinafter described, and all the people now inhabiting, and
those who shall hereafter inhabit, said district, shall be a
municipal corporation by the name of "Detroit Lakes" and by that
name may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any court or
tribunal; have perpetual succession, make and use a common seal,
and alter it at pleasure; take, hold, purchase, lease and convey
all such real, personal and mixed property, within or without
the limits of said district, as the purpose of the corporation
may require, or the transaction or exigencies of its business
may render convenient; shall be capable of contracting and being
contracted with and shall have all the general powers possessed
by municipal corporations at common law, and, in addition thereto
all powers that may be granted to it under the general laws of the
State of Minnesota, or by this Charter."
