WHEREAS: Extracurricular activities extend opportunities for socialization and interaction among high school students; and

WHEREAS: High school activities directly benefit local communities by channeling the interests of young people in a positive manner; and

WHEREAS: High school activities contribute toward developing well-rounded individuals and expanding the awareness and capabilities of high school students;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 20 through October 27, 1985, to be


High School Activities Week

FURTHER, I urge citizens to acknowledge this week appropriately and exhibit support for high school activities programs by attending an event during Minnesota High School Activities Week.


