



Proclamation


- WHEREAS: The flash flood rainfall season is rapidly approaching; and
- WHEREAS: Each year an average of 7 to 10 flash floods occur in Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: On July 6, 1978, a flash flood event occurred in Rochester, Minnesota that resulted in five deaths and 50 million dollars in property damage; and
- WHEREAS: In 1972, flash floods in Minnesota resulted in six deaths and over 28 million dollars in damage; and
- WHEREAS: Flash floods on numerous occasions have caused the need for evacuation of campers from recreational areas in Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: In June 1983, up to 12 inches of rain fell on portions of the Clearwater River basin causing flash flooding in Meeker, Stearns, Wright and Sherburne counties; and
- WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota has joined with the National Weather Service Forecast Office and the American Red Cross in recognizing the need for a broad public education program on flash floods;



in Minnesota, and urge the citizenry, news media, educators and others to give their support to this worthy effort.


