-- thanks for the life of the mind in schools and colleges and universities, in music and the visual arts, in the creative spirit and hte perceptive word;

-- thanks for the network of commerce and industry, and the vision of providing justice for all through the commitment of all;

-- thanks for the devotion of our mothers and fathers expressed through churches, synagoges, or the sanctuary of the single soul.

Toward the expression of this thankfulness throughout our commonwealth of differing but kindred persons; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November 22, 1984, to be

THANKSGIVING DAY
