WHEREAS: This anniversary is a reminder of the vigilance and preparedness which our nation must maintain; and




NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, December 7, 1984, to be

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY


