



LUND, Assistant City Clerk of the City of Minneapolis in the County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, do hereby certify that proposed Amendment No. 102 to the City Charter of the City of Minneapolis, of which the attached is a true and correct copy, was submitted to the electorate at the General Municipal Election held on Tuesday, November 6, 1984; that notice of said Election and the proposed Amendment No. 102 to the City Charter was duly published, all pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Minnesota and the action of the City Council of the City of Minneapolis on September 14, 1984; that at the said General Municipal Election held as above stated, there were 131,685 votes cast on the question; that the number of votes cast in favor of the said proposal amendment was 83,030; that the number of votes cast against the said proposal amendment was 48,655; that the number of votes necessary for the adoption of said proposed amendment was 51 per cent, or 67,159; that said proposed Amendment No. 102 was duly adopted by the qualified voters of the City of Minneapolis and therefore becomes Amendment No. 102 to the City Charter of the City of Minneapolis.

CHARTER  
AMENDMENT NO. 102

Amending Chapter 2, Section 3, increasing terms of Council Members from two years to four years

**AN ORDINANCE 84-Or-P1**  
By Council Member Scallon

Proposing that an Amendment to Chapter 2, Section 3, of the Charter of the City of Minneapolis be submitted to the voters.

The City Council of the City of Minneapolis do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 410.12, Subdivision 5, there be submitted to the voters of Minneapolis a proposed amendment to Chapter 2, Section 3 of the Minneapolis City Charter to read as follows:

Section 3. Terms of office of Mayor and Council Members. The TERMS of office of the Mayor AND COUNCIL MEMBERS shall be four years commencing on the first business day of January of the year following THEIR election.

**ELECTIONS** — Your Committee reports that, pursuant to instructions, we met as a Canvassing Board and we have canvassed the official election returns made and submitted to the City Clerk of Minneapolis of votes cast at the City General Election on November 6, 1984, on proposed Amendment No. 102 to the Minneapolis City Charter which would establish identical four-year terms for the Mayor and Council Members beginning on the first business day of January of the year following their election.

Total number of registered voters was 290,494;

Total number of "Yes" votes was 83,030;

Total number of "No" votes was 48,655.

The number of votes necessary for the adoption of said proposed amendment was 51% of the total number of legal voters voting on the question, or 67,159:

Total number of legal voters voting on the question was 131,685.

Said proposed Amendment No. 102 to the Minneapolis City Charter was accepted.
