



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Office Systems Association is sponsoring their Twelfth Annual Symposium and Exhibition of office systems equipment at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Minneapolis on April 9 and 10, 1985; and

WHEREAS: Word processing, data processing, personal computing, telecommunications, and other related office information resources have merged to become office systems and have evolved as a means of responding to the concerns of government and industry over white collar productivity costs, the availability of tools and information to address business requirements, office equipment and space, plus the skyrocketing volume of paperwork; and

WHEREAS: The management of information and the availability of efficient and effective tools to manage information has become a driving force in use of office systems within government and industry; and

WHEREAS: Continued openness to change, as well as participation in programs of professional development, will serve Minnesota's office workers well in the years to come;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 8 through April 12, 1985, to be

Office Systems Week

in Minnesota.

FURTHER, I urge concerned people in government, business, and education throughout our state to work together to bring about the effective use of office system tools in our offices.
