

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The First ten Amendments to the Constitution of the United States, known as the Bill of Rights, were adopted on December 15, 1791; and

Freedom of speech, freedom of the press, freedom of religion, and other rights WHEREAS: essential to our way of life were proclaimed in these ten Amendments, and have been indispensable to America's progress and democratic way of life ever since; and

WHEREAS: These freedoms and the Bill of Rights will endure only if a vigilant citizenry is implacably dedicated to their defense and preservation; and

WHEREAS: It is, therefore, most appropriate for all Minnesotans and all Americans to renew their determination to preserve the guarantees afforded by these amendments for all individuals and groups;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of December 15 through December 22, 1984, to be

BILL OF RIGHTS WEEK

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State of munesola to be affixed at the State Capitol this tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-four, and of the State the one hundred twenty-seventh.
