WHEREAS: The experience of those who have lived before us is important to the success of every endeavor and purpose we undertake; and

WHEREAS: We must rely to a great extent on the lessons of history whether our goal is to instruct or entertain, to increase needed production or facilitate commerce, to build cities or govern others, to explore uncharted space or establish a family;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of February 1985, to be
