people and to encourage a keener appreciation for the heritage of all American

Citizens: and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota, Black Americans have made sigificant contributions to the arts,

industry, education, science, medicine, government and other areas; and

WHEREAS: Afro-American Month is a cooperative effort of churches, schools, groups and

institutions throughout the nation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of February 1985, to be

AFRO-AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

with the theme of the Afro-American Family: Historical Strengths for the new Century

in Minnesota.
