WHEREAS: Minnesota prides itself on being a community of lifelong learners; and

WHEREAS: The prosperity of Minnesota is based increasingly on the knowledge industry and on a workforce well schooled in information and communication technology; and

WHEREAS: Learning and economic development depend on efficient, economical and equitable access to information and communications systems; and

WHEREAS: Information is itself an essential renewable natural resources of the state; and

WHEREAS: Access to information requires networks of public and private institutions and communications systems which serve the individual and the public good; and

WHEREAS: The public good implies a public responsibility to assure the quality and diversity of information resources and library services for each individual and community to learn and to thrive; and

WHEREAS: The school, special, academic and public libraries of Minnesota are unique and essential partners in the intellectual and economic vitality of the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, February 26, 1985, to be

LIBRARY LEGISLATION DAY

in Minnesota.
