WHEREAS: The effectiveness of pre-hospital critical care is greatly enhanced by the efforts of Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedics (EMT-P) who treat and transport those in need; and

WHEREAS: Paramedics have served the public welfare in our state for over a decade with selfless dedication as licensed health care professionals under the auspices of the Minnesota Department of Health; and

WHEREAS: The existence of paramedics, working in close cooperation with other emergency medical personnel, has had a significant impact in decreasing the mortality and morbidity of the seriously ill and critical injured; and

WHEREAS: The devotion and skill demonstrated by these individuals has resulted in an impressive record of life saving service, which makes them deserving of collective recognition and public gratitude;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, April 24, 1985, to be
