



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Asthma and allergic diseases result in physical, emotional and economic hardship for more than 35 million Americans and their families; and
- WHEREAS: Thousands of Americans, many of them young, die each year from asthma even though sufficient medical knowledge and resources exist to prevent many asthma-related deaths; and
- WHEREAS: Student absenteeism is due in significant part to asthma and allergic diseases; and
- WHEREAS: Environmental conditions in the workplace often cause or exacerbate asthma and allergic diseases among employees; and
- WHEREAS: Many hospital patients suffer allergic reactions to prescribed medication; and
- WHEREAS: It is estimated that the American public pays \$2 billion per year in medical bills directly attributable to the treatment and diagnosis of asthma and allergic diseases and pays another \$2 billion per year as a result of the indirect social cost of such illnesses; and
- WHEREAS: Because of recent developments in the study of immunology, health care providers are better equipped to diagnose and treat asthma and allergic diseases; and
- WHEREAS: Increased public awareness of recent scientific advancements in the study of immunology will help dispel many of the common misconceptions concerning asthma, allergic diseases, and the victims of those illnesses;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 5 through May 11, 1985, to be
