WHEREAS: More than 85,000 children in Minnesota are being cared for in licensed care; and

WHEREAS: There are over 10,421 Child Care Workers and Family Day Care Home Providers in the state of Minnesota who are caring for young children; and

WHEREAS: Children are our society's most precious resource and their nurturance and caring are a vital necessity to our society; and

WHEREAS: Children deserve the best care society can give them when their parents are unable to care for them; and

WHEREAS: The people who take care of these children deserve to be highly respected and valued;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, May 18, 1985, to be
