



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Charles A. Lindbergh was a native Minnesotan who was raised on the banks of the Mississippi River near Little Falls; and

WHEREAS: This renowned individual brought great credit to his home state through outstanding achievements in aviation, conservation and medical research and as an author; and

WHEREAS: The main terminal at Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport will be named the Charles A. Lindbergh Terminal and an exhibition of his lifelong activity with a replica of the Spirit of St. Louis will commemorate the occasion on May 20, 1985, the 58th anniversary of his departure on the historic solo crossing of the Atlantic; and

WHEREAS: A sculpture of Charles A. Lindbergh will be unveiled on the State Capitol approach on May 25; and

WHEREAS: The Charles A. Lindbergh Fund will present its 1985 Lindbergh Award and the Lindbergh Scientific Grants at a Minneapolis dinner during the same week as our citizens honor the memory of a hero son and seek to perpetuate his ideals;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 20 through 26, 1985, to be
