The Indian Health Service was established as a separate agency under the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare on July 5, 1955, and charged with the responsibility of improving the health status of American Indians and Alaska Natives to a level WHEREAS:

comparable with the general population; and

The Bemidji Program Office administers the Indian Health Service Program for Indians WHEREAS:

living on reservations within the states of Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin; and

Medical, dental, audiology, optometry, nutrition, preventive health, and water and sewer programs are administered through various IHS clinics, hospitals, field offices WHEREAS:
