



Proclamation

WHEREAS: It is the public policy of this state to promote orderly and constructive relationships between all public employers and employees; and

WHEREAS: The legislature has determined that this policy is best accomplished by granting public employees the right to organize and choose freely their representatives; i.e., to unionize; and

WHEREAS: Albert Church of Hibbing has dedicated the past four decades to organizing and representing Minnesota public employees, from his work as a staff organizer with the United Public Workers in 1946 to his present position as Executive Director of AFSCME Council 65; and

WHEREAS: This 40 years of dedicated service has included membership on the State CIO Council, membership on the State AFL-CIO Merger Committee, International Vice Presidency of AFSCME and 20 years of service on its judicial panel; and

WHEREAS: Albert Church's decades of service are now to be followed by what we trust will be similar decades of well merited retirement;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, July 20, 1985, to be
