WHEREAS: The people of Minnesota strongly support excellence in education and research; and

WHEREAS: The Hill Monastic Manuscript Library (HMML) on this twentieth anniversary of its founding, has become the single largest microfilm repository of pre-1600 manuscripts; and

WHEREAS: HMML has helped to extend Minnesota's reputation for excellence in Medieval Studies through its ties with the Medieval Academy of America's Standing Committee on Centers and Regional Associations (CARA); and

WHEREAS: CARA has shown a strong commitment to the development of Medieval Studies in various regions of our country; and

WHEREAS: The first week in October, 1985, marks the tenth anniversary of CARA's first meeting in Minnesota, at Saint John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota;
