WHEREAS: These rights are being denied to Jews in the Soviet Union because of emigration

policies: and

The free exercise of religion is a cherished right that is being denied in the Soviet WHEREAS:

Union, where Jews are deprived of cultural and linguistic identity; and

The Helsinki Accords, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the UNESCO Convention Against Discrimination in Education, all seek to fulfill the cultural rights of minorities, including those in the Soviet Union; and WHEREAS:

Meetings between the highest leaders of the United States and the Soviet Union provide a forum for discussion of the issue of human rights; WHEREAS:
