WHEREAS: Minnesota has an annual energy bill of nearly seven billion dollars representing 13 percent of our Gross State Product; and

WHEREAS: Nearly 96 percent of Minnesota's energy supply is imported; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota is attempting to reduce its reliance on these imported traditional fuels; and

WHEREAS: Improvements in energy efficiency and the development of alternative energy resources are critical to Minnesota's economy; and

WHEREAS: Hydroelectric power is a proven, environmentally sound technology which can take advantage of water, one of Minnesota's most abundant resources; and

WHEREAS: Local governments, industries, utilities, investors, and the State of Minnesota are working together to realize the potential of hydroelectric power;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, November 13, 1985, to be

HYDRO POWER DAY

in Minnesota.
