Minnesota Crime Victims' Rights Week provides the citizens of Minnesota with the opportunity to reaffirm their commitment to recognize the rights of crime victims and support local programs that advocate for victims; and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: National Crime Victims' Rights Week has been proclaimed as April 20-26, 1986, by the

President of the United States; and

WHEREAS: The rights and needs of crime victims must be recognized by the Minnesota public; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association for Crime Victims is organized to provide a voice for all

victims: and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association for Crime Victims provides greatly needed services to empower

citizens who have been traumatized by violent crime; and

There is a dire need for programs that advocate for victims, promote accountability of WHEREAS:

the judicial system and encourage a partnership between the public and private sectors

to improve services to victims; and

The Minnesota Association for Crime Victims is urging all Minnesotans who are concerned about violent crime to join together to promote greater public awareness about WHEREAS:
