



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The "Tornado Season" is rapidly approaching, and Minnesota lies along the northern edge of the region of maximum tornado frequency; and

WHEREAS: Each year, an average of 18 tornados touch down at various locations in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: On August 6, 1969, tornados caused 15 deaths and 2.2 million dollars of property damage; and

WHEREAS: On June 28, 1979, 15 tornados occurred during one evening in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: On September 2, 1980, tornados caused one death and over 11.5 million dollars property damage in Stearns County; and

WHEREAS: In 1981, 41 tornados struck Minnesota, the worst of which caused approximately 37 million dollars damage to the Minneapolis/St. Paul metropolitan area, killed one person and injured 83; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota has joined with the National Weather Service and the American Red Cross in recognizing the need for a broad public education program on severe weather;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the third week of March to be

TORNADO AWARENESS WEEK

in Minnesota.

FURTHER, I urge the citizenry, news media, educators and others to give their support to this worthy effort.
