



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Forty years ago, six million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and

WHEREAS: The people of the state of Minnesota should remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such horrors may never be repeated; and

WHEREAS: The people of the state of Minnesota should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and

WHEREAS: The people of the state of Minnesota should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish;

WHEREAS: May 6, 1986, has been designated pursuant to an Act of Congress and internationally as a Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust; and

WHEREAS: It is appropriate for the people of the state of Minnesota to join in the international commemoration;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 6 through May 13, 1986, to be

DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE OF THE VICTIMS OF THE HOLOCAUST

in Minnesota.
