

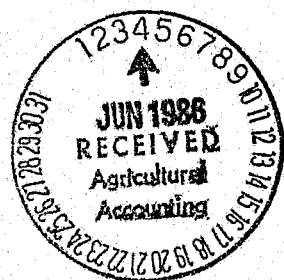

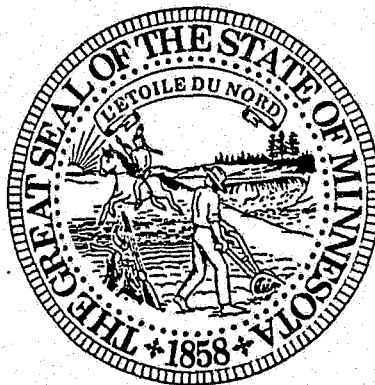

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EFFECTIVE DATE

Effective July 1, 1986, this revised schedule of fees supersedes all other fee schedules issued by the Department of Agriculture for Grain Inspection and Weighing Services.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

The fees set forth in this schedule relate to the sampling, inspection, weighing and certification services at permanently staffed inspection points. Federal Grain Inspection Service Supervision Fees are assessed in accordance with the schedule shown on page 9 of this schedule.

REGULAR HOURS

Inspection Services - 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
Sampling and Weighing Services - 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
These hours are for Monday through Friday. All other hours, including Saturday, Sunday, and all Holidays, shall be considered overtime unless a concurrent second or third shift exists at a permanently staffed location.

*Holidays falling on a Saturday are observed on the Friday before the Holiday. Holidays falling on Sunday are observed on the following Monday.

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SERVICE REQUESTS

To assure prompt service at designated inspection points beyond the regular hours, request must be received by:

1. 12:00 noon for 2nd or 3rd shifts, Monday through Friday.
2. 2:00 p.m. of the preceding workday for services on Saturday, Sunday, or Holidays.
3. 2:00 p.m. on the preceding workday for services at locations not permanently staffed.

CANCELLATIONS

A minimum of four (4) hours standby per employee will be assessed for requested service unless the request is cancelled by:

1. 12:00 noon for 2nd or 3rd shift on regular workdays.
2. 3:00 p.m. on the regular workday preceding the Saturday, Sunday, or Holidays.

HOURLY CHARGES

Regular Hours - \$23.00 per hour per employee (Includes travel time).

Overtime Hours - \$11.50 per hour per employee when loading or unloading is in process.

Standby Overtime - \$34.50 per hour per employee (Includes travel time).

Hourly charges will apply when:

1. no other fee is established.
2. appropriate fee does not cover the cost of provided services.
 - a. Service requested during overtime hours.
 - b. Travel time when services are requested at locations other than permanently established service points.

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3. Standby or down-time occurs for requested services that cannot be provided through no fault of the Department.
4. Applicant desires to contract Department employees on an hourly basis for a minimum of one year in lieu of published fees.

A minimum of three (3) hours, at the appropriate overtime rate, will be assessed on Saturday, Sunday, or Holidays.

TRAVEL EXPENSES

Mileage charge of \$.30 per round trip mile will be assessed. Mileage charges for route sampling will be assessed from the sampling point to the nearest freight drop service point.

When an employee incurs additional expenses (i.e., meals, lodging, etc.) while performing requested services, the expenses will be charged back to the applicant. When employee is required to work ten (10) or more consecutive hours during continuous loading or unloading operations, the cost of a meal will be charged back to the applicant.

SUNFLOWER SEED OIL TEST

Requests for oil tests for sunflower seed will be forwarded to the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture in Superior. Test results and billing for these services will be handled by their official agency.

TIMELY PAYMENT

Invoices will be issued monthly for services rendered. If payment is not received within thirty (30) days of the invoice date, a service charge of one and one half percent (1½%) per month will be assessed. Services may be withheld until the delinquent account is paid in full. Delinquent accounts may be subject to prepayment for requested services.
