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7. The special election is to be held on Tuesday, February 7, in the same manner as a General Election as far as possible.

8. The returns of the special election should be canvassed in each county on Tuesday, February 8, and a statement of the vote cast transmitted immediately by the county auditor of each county to the Secretary of State, who will canvass the statements and issue a certificate of election to the successful candidates.

In case not more than two candidates should file, no primary election should be held, of which fact you will be promptly notified from this office so that you can give it such publicity as it is possible.

The statute does not require that the fee that an affidavit may be in the mail at the time for filing is not sufficient to comply with the law, unless it actually arrives at the office of the Secretary of State before the close of the time for filing.

3. In case as the time for filing has expired, the Secretary of State will certify to you the names of the candidates, and you will then proceed to prepare a primary election ballot, without party designation, as provided by the Primary Election Law. A sample ballot should be posted and published as soon as possible, though of course it will be impossible to give a full week's published notice of the sample ballot as of the regular primary.

4. The Primary Election is to be held on Tuesday, January 11, in the same manner as a regular primary as far as possible.

5. The returns of the primary should be canvassed in each county on Monday, February 1, and the results certified immediately by the respective county auditors to the county auditor of Washington County, which must be filed with the Secretary of State at the last general election. The county auditor of Washington County should immediately tabulate the returns and certify the names of the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes to the other county auditors, and should also notify the successful candidate of their nomination.

6. On receipt of the notice from the county auditor of Washington County of the names of the two winners, the respective county auditors should immediately prepare ballots for the special election, following the statutes relating to the preparation of ballots for general elections as far as possible.

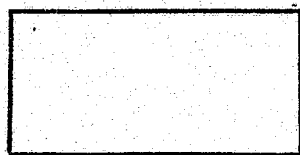

Important points to remember are:

1. Notice of election and primary, signed by the County Auditor, should be issued and posted in each election district in the usual manner not later than Saturday January 20. Publication of the notice in a newspaper is not required by law, but it is desirable that on such newspaper publicity be given as possible.

2. Candidates must file with the Secretary of State and pay the regular filing fee of \$10 not later than Monday January 21, in the manner provided by the Election Code law, S. S. 1937, Section 267. Filing affidavits and fees must be received in the

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7. The special election is to be held on Tuesday, February 7, in the same manner as a general election as far as possible.

8. The returns of the special election should be canvassed in each county on Tuesday, February 8, and a statement of the vote cast transmitted immediately by the county auditor of each county to the Secretary of State, who will canvass the statements and issue a certificate of election to the successful candidate.

Your attention is called to the provisions of the statutes relating to such elections, S. S. 1923, Sections 262-270, inclusive, which should be carefully followed.

Important points to remember are:

1. Notice of election and primary, signed by the County Auditor, should be issued and posted in each election district in the usual manner not later than Saturday January 23. Publication of the notice in a newspaper is not required by law, but it is desirable that so much newspaper publicity be given as possible.

2. Candidates must file with the Secretary of State and pay the regular filing fee of \$10 not later than Monday January 24, in the manner provided by the Primary Election Law, S. S. 1923, Section 277. Filing affidavits and fees must be received in the

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office of Secretary of State not later than 5 P.M. of that date in order to be accepted.
