



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Korean War began on June 25, 1950, and ended on July 27, 1953, lasting only three years; and

WHEREAS: In those three years, 54,236 Americans died in the Korean War, 103,000 were wounded and 8,177 were missing in action; and

WHEREAS: "America's Forgotten War" took the lives of 700 Minnesotans; and

WHEREAS: July 27, 1986, marks the 33rd Anniversary of the Korean War cease fire;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, July 27, 1986, to be

in Minnesota in honor of those who gave their lives for our country.
