- WHEREAS: Walter W. Heller recently retired from the faculty of the University of Minnesota after forty years of distinguished service as Professor of Economics and, since 1966, as Regent's Professor of Economics; and
- WHEREAS: He has introduced more than 50,000 students at the University of Minnesota to the study of economics through his lectures in the first course in economics; and
- WHEREAS: He has promoted economic education throughout the State of Minnesota and indeed, the whole United States through his many writings and speeches; and
- WHEREAS: He has for more than three decades been adviser and consultant to governors and other elected officials of the State of Minnesota on matters of economic policy in general and tax policy in particular; and
- WHEREAS: He served with great distinction as Chairman of the Council of Economic Advisers under Presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson from 1961 to 1964 and continues to serve as economic adviser and consultant to committees of the Congress of the United States; and
- WHEREAS: He is being honored this evening by his colleagues at the University of Minnesota for his outstanding leadership and dedicated service to the Department of Economics;
