

## Proclamation

	WHEREAS;	From 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murlered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other people perished as victims of
		Nazism; and
	WHEREAS:	The people of the State of Vinnesota should always remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such horrors never be repeated; and
	WHEREAS:	The people of the State of Minnesota should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and
	WHEREAS;	The people of Minnesota should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and
	WHEREAS:	April 26 has been designated pursuant to an Act of Congress and internationally as a Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust known as Yom Hashoah; and
	WHEREAS:	It is appropriate for the people of Minnesota to join in the international commemoration;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 26 through May 6 to be

in Vinnesota, in memory of the victims of the Holocaust, and in the hope that we will always strive to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through education, vigilance, and resistance.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Vinnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twentieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven, and of the State the one hundred twenty-eighth.
