WHEREAS: This year marks the two hundredth anniversary of the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS: The Hamline Law Review has observed this anniversary through the development of the special project, "Perspectives on the Constitution;" and

WHEREAS: "Perspectives on the Constitution" is the first time in two hundred years that a significant number of national and international figures have joined in a single effort and stated their views on the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS: "Perspectives on the Constitution" is a valuable contribution to American history and is an important educational resource for understanding the American people's diverse views of the United State Constitution;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 11 to be
