WHEREAS: Dorothy Molter, the last year-round resident of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area in northern Minnesota, was a friend to all Minnesotans and an inspiration to the 7,000 canoeists who visited her cabin campsite each year; and

WHEREAS: Filmmakers Wade Black and Judith Hadel have worked four years to produce the documentary film DOROTHY MOLTER: LIVING IN THE BOUNDARY WATERS; and

WHEREAS: More than 100 individuals, foundations, businesses, and state and federal agencies--including the Minnesota State Arts Board and the National Endowment for the Arts--have assisted Ms. Hadel and Mr. Black in the completion of this special film; and

WHEREAS: This film will premiere in Minnesota at the Vermillion Campus of Arrowhead Community College in Ely, and at the Jerome Hill Theatre of Film in the Cities in St. Paul; and
