WHEREAS: Ancient Greece was the birthplace of democratic ideals; and

WHEREAS: Modern Greece suffered under 400 years of Turkish Ottoman subjugation and cruelties;

and

WHEREAS: During the enslavement under Turkish Ottoman rule Greeks continued to fight for

freedom under the cry, "Liberty or death"; and

WHEREAS: On March 25, 1821, Greece emerged once again as a Nation of free peoples fighting a

tyrannical regime; and

WHEREAS: March 25, 1987, marks the 166th year of Greek Independence where the principles and

the preservation of civil and human rights reign supreme; and

WHEREAS: Americans of Greek heritage have contributed significantly to the American ideal of

democratic principles and laws by drawing on their Greek heritage;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 25, 1987, to be

GREEK INDEPENDENCE DAY:

A CELEBRATION OF GREEK AND AMERICAN DEMOCRACY

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital this twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven, and of the State the one hundred twenty-eighth.
