WHEREAS: The people who worked in the mines--many of whom were European immigrants--helped form the basis of the character of the people in the great State of Minnesota; and


WHEREAS: The Hill Annex Mine Tours still remembers these miners and their contributions by celebrating Miner's Day on the third Sunday of July;

MINER'S DAY


in Minnesota.


