

## **Proclamation**

WHEREAS: America's men and women have served their country heroically and faithfully since the Revolutionary War; and

Thousands of Americans and Minnesotans who have served in these wars were captured by the enemy or became missing in action; and WHEREAS:

Over 2,400 such men and women remain unaccounted for from the Vietnam War, including 44 WHEREAS: Minnesotans, and over 8,800 remain unaccounted for from the Korean Conflict, including 121 Vinnesotans; and

AHEREAS: The American government is still receiving reports of the possibility that many missing in action/prisoners of war (MIA/POW) are alive and being held against their will, thus creating an unbeamble uncertainty among the families and loved ones of the missing; and

The State of Minnesota has not the MIA/POW issue to the national forefront by flying the MIA/POW flan on the Minnesota Capitol Building; designating by legislative resolution the display of a red ribbon as a "red budge of courage" regarding our missing citizens; and by an executive order of the Governor urging the display of a red ribbon on public buildings as a symbol of awareness for those unaccounted for on the congressionally designated day of recognition (September 18, 1947); and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: All veteran's organizations and all concerned citizens in the nation and Minnesota have set aside this day of recognition and a week of awareness to educate themselves and promote a speedy accounting for of those listed as missing in action in all wars, especially the Korean and Vietnam conflicts; and

In Minnesota, this week of awareness will culminate in ceremonies on the Minnesota Capital grounds on Sunday, September 20, 1987; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Peroich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 13 through September 19 to be

MIA/POW AWARENESS WEEK

and September 19 to be

MIA/POW RECOGNITION DAY
