- WHEREAS: The state of Minnesota is graced with significant prairie resources; and
- WHEREAS: These prairies and adjacent lands possess outstanding scenic, educational, natural, scientific, economic, and spiritual values; and
- WHEREAS: The preservation of these prairies and landscapes is essential to maintain their beauty and usefulness for future generations; and
- WHEREAS: Federal, state and local units of government have taken action to preserve and protect prairies; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesotans should recognize the importance of prairies for preserving plants, birds and butterflies among other life forms; and
- WHEREAS: The state of Minnesota has taken a leading role in innovative protection, prudent management and use of these prairie resources;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim July 29 to be
