

Proclamation

WHEREAS:

The U.S. Government formally recognized registered apprenticeship in 1937 with the

enactment of the "Fitzgerald National Apprenticeship Act;" and

WHEREAS:

Since 1937 more than 5 million apprentices have been trained to become the nucleus of

America's skilled workforce; and

WHEREAS:

48 years ago, the Minnesota Legislature recognized the wisdom of a sound training system for highly skilled craft workers and enacted the "Voluntary Apprenticeship Law"

and has since produced over 40,000 graduates; and

WHEREAS:

In conjunction with and in honor of the 50th Anniversary celebration of the "Fitzgerald Act," to be held in Washington, D.C., August 16-21, 1987;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August to be

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP MONTH

in Minnesota.
