The ability and opportunity to read is of fundamental importance to all people; and

WHEREAS: This nation and state were founded by, and now depend upon, a literate, informed

citizenry; and

It has been acknowledged that the problems of illiteracy and aliteracy pose a serious threat to the well-being of an alarming number of Minnesotans deserving of our immediate and continued support for educational opportunities; and WHEREAS:

The year 1986 marks the beginning of the Minnesota Adult Literacy Campaign, Inc., a five-year commitment to providing adult education for the estimated 600,000 who cannot read; and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: Reading is a gateway to entertainment, imagination and achievement for all who posess

the skills to access its information; and

This joyful acknowledgement of reading is something that is too often taken for granted by those who can read; and WHEREAS:

The theme of this campaign will be "Go Places; Read" and be the official participation by Minnesota in Project literacy U.S. (PLUS); and WHEREAS:

The commitment to this campaign begins in September and will continue for a full year; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 1986 through September 1987 to be

and May 27 to be

MERRITT DAY

in Minnesota.
