

RESOLVED, That it be, and it hereby is declared by the Village Council of the Village of Long Lake,

That at a special village election held at Orono Town Hall, in said village, in the County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, on the 17th day of April, 1906, "to vote on the question whether such village of Long Lake will continue to exist under the General Laws of the State of Minnesota and amendments thereto, under which said village of Long Lake became incorporated, or will become reincorporated under the "Revised Laws, 1905", the following number of votes were cast for and against said proposition as canvassed by us, to-wit:

There were cast "For Reincorporation-Yes-", twenty-three votes.

There were cast "For Reincorporation -No-", no votes; and

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the recorder of said village be, and he is hereby directed to prepare and file forthwith, a certified copy of this resolution with the County Auditor of the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, and another certified copy of said resolution with the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota.
