WHEREAS: The disease AIDs is now widely recognized to be the leading public health problem of

our time; and

It has been estimated that 270,000 people will have been diagnosed with AIDS nationwide—and 180,000 of those people will have died—by the end of 1991; and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: up to 1,800 of those AIDS cases will have been diagnosed here in Minnesota-and up to

1,200 AIDS deaths will occur in our state-before the end of 1990; and

WHEREAS: The unchecked spread of this aisease coula have a devastating impact on our state

and our nation; and

WHEREAS: In the absence of an effective treatment or vaccine, information and education remain

our most effective weapons in the battle against this disease—and our most effective means of controlling its spread; and

WHEREAS:

Our state has already assumed a leadership role in making use of educational, informational and disease control strategies to help contain the spread of the AIDS virus;

Interested individuals, groups and government agencies will be mobilized during the month of October 1987—here in Minnesota and nationwide—to help focus public WHEREAS:

attention on the wrgency of these efforts;
