RESOLUTION 87-0910

ADOPTED NOVEMBER 16, 1987

BY COUNCILOR PAYMAR:

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, Sec. 423A.19, authorizes a police or salaried firefighter relief association to amend its bylaws, with the approval of the governing body of the municipality, to provide that members with at least five years of active service credited by the relief association would be entitled to a pro rata service pension upon reaching the normal retirement age; and

WHEREAS, the Duluth Police Pension Association (Association) has voted to amend its bylaws as shown in the attached Exhibit A (Public Document No. 87-1116-14) to provide for such five-year vesting of members' pensions, and has requested approval of such bylaw amendment by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Association has provided the City Council with an actuarial valuation prepared by the actuary of the Association showing the financial impact of the proposed bylaw amendment, which actuarial valuation has been reviewed by the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Duluth City Council hereby gives its approval to the amendment to the bylaws of the Association set forth in Exhibit A attached to this resolution.

Resolution 87-0910 was unanimously adopted.

AMENDMENT TO BYLAWS OF DULUTH POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE VI of the Bylaws of the Duluth Police Pension Association is hereby amended as follows:

1) Paragraph (b) is amended to read:

"(b) To any member of the age of fifty (50) years or more who performs duty as a member of the police department of the City of Duluth for twenty (20) five (5) years or more, upon his written application after retiring from such duty there shall be paid monthly during his lifetime a pension not to exceed 31 units and one additional unit for the first year of such service in excess of 20 years and two additional units for each year of service in excess of 21 years, but not to exceed 40 - 40.8 units, which shall be calculated as follows:

2) Paragraph (c) is amended to read:

"(c) To any member who performs duty as a member of the police department of the City for twenty (20) five (5) years or more who retires from such duty before he attains the age of 50 years, upon his written application after reaching the age of 50 years, there shall be paid monthly during his lifetime a pension not to exceed 31 units and one additional unit for the first year of such service in excess of 20 years and two additional units for each year in excess of 21 years, but not to exceed 40 $\underline{40.8}$ units, which shall be calculated as follows:

For each year of service through 20 years	-	1.59	<u>units</u>
For the 21st year of service	I.	1	unit
For each year of service in excess of 21 years	_	2	<u>units"</u>

3) Paragraph (d) is amended to read:

"(d) To any member who, while a member of the police department of the City of Duluth, becomes diseased or sustains an injury which permanently unfits him from the performance of police duties there shall be paid monthly during his lifetime a pension as provided in these By-Laws but not to exceed 40 40.8 units, while so disabled, but no member shall be

awarded, or paid a pension pursuant to this clause, except upon the certificate of two or more physicians or surgeons chosen by the Governing Board. This certificate shall set forth the cause, nature and extent of the disability, disease, or injury of the member. No member shall be awarded, granted, or paid a pension pursuant to this clause unless the certificate states that the disability, disease, or injury was incurred or sustained by him while a member of the police department of the City of Duluth. Each such certificate shall be filed with and acted upon by the Association at a regular or special meeting; and at its discretion the Governing Board may require any such person to submit to a re-examination by a competent physician chosen by the Board. If found by this re-examination to be physically fit, such person shall be reinstated to the position held immediately prior to the commencement of the member's disability.

The Governing Board may recommend and the Association at a regular or special meeting shall determine the amount of pension to be paid to each individual disabled member while so disabled. The Governing Board and Association shall be guided in determining the amount of pension by the percentage of disability as shown by the report of the examining physicians or surgeons, the disabled member's ability to enter other fields of gainful employment and the number of years of duty in the police department. Such pension shall never be less than one and one-half units for each year of such active police service and shall not exceed forty (40) 40.8 units. The amount of the pension may be subject to review by the Association at any subsequent meeting upon its own initiative or upon the request of the disabled member."

I certify that the foregoing amendment to the Bylaws of the Duluth Police Pension Association was duly adopted by the membership of the Duluth Police Pension Association at a special meeting held on October 13, 1987.
