



## Proclamation

WHEREAS: There is no known single explanation of why a child has learning disabilities and no specific cause for difficulty in development. However, children with learning disabilities, as defined by federal law, constitute four to five percent of the total school age population; and

WHEREAS: Each child, adolescent or adult with a learning disability is unique. Each has a different combination and severity of problems in the essential learning process—visual, auditory, communications, motor control and logic, among others; and

WHEREAS: Effective treatment must include a total approach to the educational, psychological, medical and sociological needs of the individual. During this month, the Minnesota Association for Children and Adults with Learning Disabilities (MACLD) will be holding their Annual Fall Conference on November 6 and 7, at the Sheraton Park Place in St. Louis Park, Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November to be

LEARNING DISABILITIES MONTH

in Minnesota.
