



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Jack V. Hoene was born on August 27, 1939 in Duluth, Minnesota, the first of eleven children born to his parents; and
- WHEREAS: Jack grew up and married Judy, and they had two children of their own, Kathy and John; and
- WHEREAS: Jack lived in Duluth for 28 years, and was an avid hunter, fisherman and hockey player in Duluth; and
- WHEREAS: Jack's great love for the outdoors was displayed through his work; he was the Minnesota Sports Fishing Representative to the Great Lakes Fishing Commission, was appointed to the Minnesota Sea Grant Extension Advisory Council, was on the Board of Directors of the Lake Superior Steelhead Association and was President of the Minnesota Sports Fishing Congress; and
- WHEREAS: Jack, a talented writer, was an active member for 22 years of the Outdoor Writers Association of America, and a columnist for 20 years for the OUTDOOR NEWS; and
- WHEREAS: Jack shared his interest and enthusiasm for the sport of hockey through working as a coach and referee of Burnsville youth hockey, as chairman of the Task Force that built Burnsville Ice Center and by writing a weekly column in LET'S PLAY HOCKEY;
