

- a) Community Service Officers/Traffic Aids may enforce state motor vehicle laws and MAC ordinances relating to motor vehicles, as the same may be amended, except for violations involving the movement of motor vehicles.
- b) Fire Inspection Personnel may enforce fire prevention ordinances including, but not limited to, Ordinance 52.
- c) Building/Zoning Inspectors may enforce building and zoning ordinances.

**SECTION 3. SAVINGS CLAUSE**

If any part or parts of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional, such unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance. The Commission hereby declares it would have passed the remaining parts of this Ordinance if it had known that such part or parts thereof would be declared unconstitutional.

**SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect upon the filing of the same with proof of publication thereof with the Secretary of State of Minnesota.

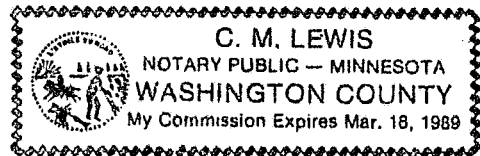
