

Proclamation

From 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other people perished as victims of *Nazism; and WHEREAS:

The people of the State of Minnesota should always remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such horrors are never repeated; and WHEREAS:

The people of the State of Minnesota should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and WHEREAS:

The people of the State of Minnesota should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and WHEREAS:

April 14 has been designated pursuant to an Act of Congress as a Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known internationally as Yom Hashoah; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 10 through April 17, 1988 to be

THE DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE

OF THE VICTIMS OF THE HOLOCAUST

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have herewito set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital withis fourteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-eight, and of the State the one hundred thirtieth.
