



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: International Falls is situated on the Canadian border of the United States on the weather side of a great land mass extending to the Arctic; and
- WHEREAS: International Falls is subject to frequent outbreaks of continental polar air throughout most of the year; and
- WHEREAS: International Falls has the northern-most, round the clock federal weather bureau in the contiguous 48 states; and
- WHEREAS: International Falls in one year went through six straight weeks in which the temperature never rose above zero; and
- WHEREAS: In 1983 the low temperatures for International Falls for December, January and February were minus 40, minus 24 and minus 27 degrees below zero; and
- WHEREAS: International Falls has been nationally renowned as the Icebox of the Nation since the 1940s and 50s; and
- WHEREAS: Companies from around the world come to International Falls to do cold weather testing and research;

NOW, THEREFORE I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

INTERNATIONAL FALLS TO BE THE
COLD WEATHER RESEARCH CAPITOL OF THE NATION
