



## Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency is sponsoring the 51st Annual Wastewater Operations Seminar on Wednesday, March 23rd, 1988; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency has always strongly emphasized the construction and proper operation of wastewater treatment plants as part of the state's overall plan to protect water quality; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota has a strong interest in, and has contributed financially toward the construction of new and upgraded wastewater treatment facilities through its State Independent Grants Program; and

WHEREAS: Through our attention to construction of wastewater treatment plants, Minnesota has been rewarded with a substantial reduction in water pollution coming from point sources during the last twenty years, and wastewater plant operators are a major part of this success; and

WHEREAS: The presence of well-trained and conscientious wastewater plant operators is an important factor in the successful operation and maintenance of water treatment plants; and
