

## EMERGENCY DECLARATION

WHEREAS, several deteriorating canisters of hydrocyanic acid fumigant are presently being stored in the City of Anoka, Anoka County, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, these hazardous materials endanger public health and safety and local resources are inadequate to handle the situation; and

WHEREAS, this hydrocyanic acid fumigant is highly unstable and movement from the present place of storage would further endanger public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, this hydrocyanic acid fumigant may be safely rendered harmless by a nationally-recognized demolition expert who is presently available to dispose of this material.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby declare, pursuant to authority granted by Minnesota Statutes sections 12.21 through 12.46 (1986), that an emergency exists in the City of Anoka, Anoka County, Minnesota, through the presence of these hazardous materials.
