

Proclamation

In June of 1942, the Japanese attacked Alaska's Aleutian Islands, becoming the first WHEREAS: invaders since the War of 1812 to hold ground on the American home front; and

The Battle of Attu was one of the most fierce in the Pacific theater, with the weather and terrain claiming more casualties and aircraft than the enemy; and WHEREAS:

A quarter-million Americans were stationed in Alaska between 1940-1944. They built important infrastructure, including airports, harbors, and roads, in a wast and WHEREAS:

undeveloped territory; and

In spite of intense military activity and engagement in Alaska, the Alaska front has WHEREAS:

become a forgotten war; and
