WHEREAS: Alvera Lohmann was one of Zumbrota Community Hospital's first patients when she entered the hospital over 30 years ago for treatment for polio, and the hospital has been home to her ever since; and

WHEREAS: Alvera Lohmann is the longest surviving polio patient on respiration in the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota legislators passed a special exemption during the 1988 legislative session allowing Alvera Lohmann to remain in the Zumbrota Community Hospital; and

WHEREAS: The people of the Zumbrota community have shown their love and concern for Alvera through various acts of generosity, affection and friendship; and

WHEREAS: Alvera Lohmann remains a constant source of cheerfulness, courage and spiritual motivation; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, May 4, 1988 to be

ALVERA LOHMANN DAY

in Minnesota.
